







## FEST FS BRITNEY SPEARS OF The Rich & Famous



Instead of dwelling on losing visitation privileges with her kids on Oct. 18, the pop tart ducked into the doctor's office and got — no, not a prescription for antidepressants, but a plump new pucker! Star asked Beverly Hills plastic surgeon Renato Calabria, M.D., what Brit may have done to get her super-

size kisser. "We call this lip augmentation," says Dr. Calabria, who does not treat Britney. "There are different types of fillers [to choose from], and in some cases, surgery could be involved. But more commonly, a filler is used." Dr. Calabria thinks Britney had about one syringe of the filler Juvéderm injected in both her upper and lower lips, with a touch more in the upper. "[Juvéderm is] the latest, most cutting-edge filler, so I think Britney Spears would go with that," he tells *Star*. Results last four to five months, and the procedure takes just five minutes! Best of all, allergic reactions to Juvéderm are very rare, says Dr. Calabria. The cost? \$600 to \$800.
